



More health workers, better health outcomes





Health Workers Reach Index and use of contraception in low and middle income countries








MDGs → SDGs

Goal: Universal Health Coverage



Three dimensions to consider when moving towards universal coverage

Specific Health Goals

Ending Preventable Maternal and Child Deaths

- Reduce child mortality to 20 or fewer child deaths per 1,000 live births by 2035
- Reduce maternal mortality to 50 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births by 2035

AIDS-Free Generation

- Reduce infections among children by 90%, and
- Reduce AIDS-related maternal mortality by 50% by 2015

Population Growth Is Outstripping Health Workforce Expansion

Impact of Population Growth on Health Workers Needed (2000-2050): A Hypothetical Example

Economic Benefits of Health

- Healthy workers are up to 2 times more productive
- Malaria costs Africa \$12 billion per year in lost productivity, slowing GDP growth by as much as 1.3 percent a year
- Poor health is the #1 cause of impoverishment.
- Businesses are more likely to locate in areas with a healthy workforce.

Economic Benefits of Improved HRH Management: Capacity *Plus Results*

- Dominican Republic: \$4 million saved per year by eliminating ghost worker wages
- Globally: \$110 million saved by using iHRIS rather than propriety HR Information Systems






Economic Benefits of Improved HRH Management: Capacity *Plus* **Results (2)**

- Government of Uganda is hiring 6,000 new health workers based on improved data
- Zanzibar government hired 728 new health workers based on improved data (30% increase)
