About PPD Africa Regional Office

- ➤ The 2006 PPD Board meeting decided to reinforce South-South cooperation in Africa
- ➤ AS part of PPD global PPD Africa Regional office was established in February 2007 in Kampala, Uganda.
- PPD ARO operates and functions according to signed MOU with the Government of Uganda (free space, tax free status, support staff, etc)
- ➤ A Strategic Plan that guides the work of the office was developed for the period 2007-2011

VISION AND MISSION OF PPD ARO

Vision "A continent that meets its reproductive health needs, promotes the population and development agenda and thereby addresses poverty, through south-south cooperation"

Mission: PPD Africa, as part of the global south-south inter-governmental alliance, provides a platform for the promotion of and resource mobilization for Reproductive Health, Population and Development in Africa through three elements:

- -Policy dialogue;
- -Networking and building strategic partnerships in the region;
- -Sharing of experiences.

Some of ARO's achievements since establishment

- Developed parliamentary leadership for, and commitment to family planning and reproductive health in the region
- Created champions for SRHR in Africa, including First Ladies, Cultural Leaders and Parliamentarians
- Helped strengthen accountability for the Maputo Plan of Action as continental framework for the achievement of the ICPD and MDGs targets
- Built strategic partnership with key institutions in the region (African Union, CAFS, APHRC, AFIDEP, SEAPACOH, EARHN, WARHN, SARHN, etc)
- Attracted many donors (Hewlett, Gates and Packard Foundations, UNFPA, DSW, IntraHealth, Women Deliver and others
