Background

- The first International Conference in Population and Development (ICPD) was held in Cairo in 1994 and representatives from 179 governments adopted the ICPD Programme of Action (POA)
- The ICPD POA was to be implemented in twenty years' period from 1994 to 2014 and placed human well-being as the centre of the global development agenda.
- During the sixty fifth session of the United Nations General Assembly held in 2011, the POA and the key actions were extended for further implementation beyond 2014 by 5 years to ensure that the goals and objectives were fully met






Background Continued

THEMATIC AREAS

The Nairobi Summit will have 5 thematic areas and 5 Cross-Cutting Accelerators that are broad so as to include many areas

Thematic areas

- 1. Creating financing momentum
- 2. Getting to zero: Essential Sexual Reproductive Health (SRHR) package of interventions and UHC
- 3. Demographic transition and Sustainable Development
- 4. Getting to Zero: GBV and harmful practices
- 5. SRHR in Humanitarian and fragile contexts





Cross-Cutting Accelerators

5 Cross-Cutting Accelerators that will help magnify the Impact of the ICPD POA are:

- 1. Women's empowerment and gender equity
- 2. Youth leadership
- 3. Political and Community leaders
- 4. Innovation and data
- 5. Strategic Partnership and South-South Cooperation
