 - SSC strengthens regional relationship;
- d SSC mechanism to also from other countries

South South Cooperation (SSC)

e Facilitates achievement of development goals, including the SDGs and ICPD PoA;

BKKBN has an impressive legacy of SSC programmes on family planning since 1980s.

Indonesia is in the process of establishing a single agency to deal with SSC programmes;

SSC is not a training programme. It is a learning experience.








Indonesia's SSC on Family Planning Related Issues 1980-2017
