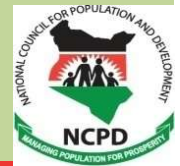

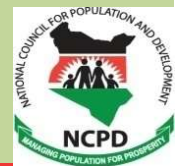

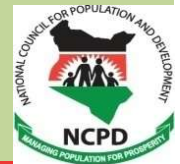

# A look back on 2017 commitments

- **Amend the National Health Insurance Fund Act to provide universal health care**
  - Done with piloting in 4 counties; efforts towards registering indigents
- **Enactment of the Health Bill into an Act of Parliament**
  - Bill enacted allowing UHC
  - Inclusion of special groups, secondary school students, civil servants disciplined forces and the general public

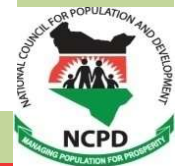
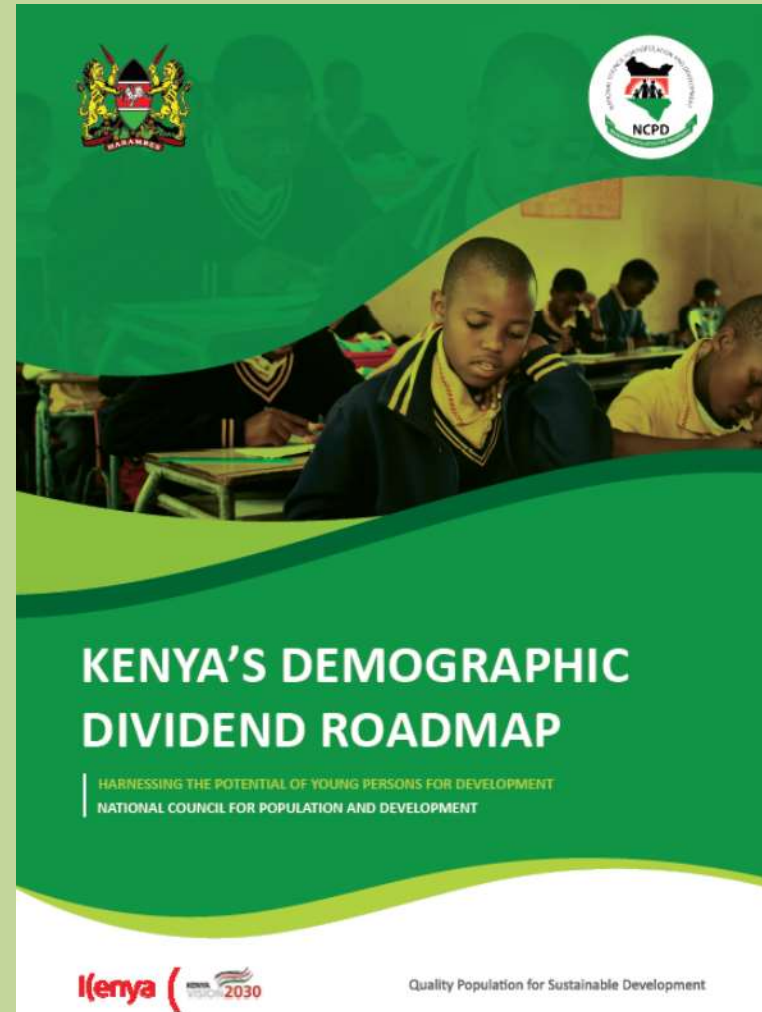




# Kenya Commitments cont...

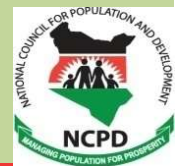

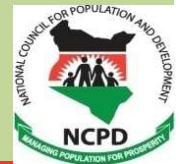
