Terms of Reference

PPD is an Inter-Governmental Organization (IGO) comprising 27 developing countries from Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean, and the Middle East. These member countries collectively represent nearly 60% of the world's population. PPD was founded at the International Conference on Population and Development {ICPD} in Cairo, Egypt, in September 1994, with a mandate to consolidate, institutionalize, strengthen and promote South-South Cooperation (SSC) in the field of Reproductive Health, Population and Development. PPD has its Permanent Secretariat based in Dhaka, Bangladesh, having a Diplomatic Status in Bangladesh. PPD is governed by a Board comprising of Ministers designated by the member states. It has an Executive Committee elected by the Board, and national level activities coordinated by Partner Country Coordinators (PCCs) who are senior government officials of the member states appointed by the Respective Board Members. A representative of the UNFPA is ex-officio with the Board. The Government of the Peoples Republic of Bangladesh is the Permanent Member in the PPD Executive Committee.

International Journal for South South Cooperation in Population and Development is a peerreviewed international online journal publishing findings from high quality research and learning from policy and programmes of the global south. The focus of the journal is to promote South-South Cooperation and Perspectives on Population and Development. This journal is expected to provide an important scientific platform to address critical issues, exchange new ideas and disseminate the latest developments in basic research, policy dialogue, strategy development and regulatory issues focusing on Population, Development and Reproductive Health issues using the SSC mechanism as an alternative development discourse. The journal is a comprehensive and inclusive platform for scholarly discussions, research dissemination, and knowledge exchange providing an opportunity to explore various interconnected themes. The e-Journal incorporates diverse themes and other topics relevant to ICPD goals and SDGs. These themes can encompass a wide range of topics, fostering interdisciplinary discussions and collaborations. The themes include South South Cooperation Approaches and Measurements, Case Studies of Successful of South South Collaborations, Population Policies and Strategies, Population Dynamics and Demographic Transitions, Health Systems Strengthening: Technologies and Innovations, Economic Development and Population Growth, Climate Change and Environmental Impact, Poverty Alleviation, Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment, Youth Empowerment and Education and Maternal and Child Health Programs. The journal is a platform for publishing multidisciplinary work carried out in the global south using variety of methodologies of social science disciplines, such as demography, economics, sociology, anthropology, development studies, and international relations with focus on health diplomacy. Each issue will contain original research articles, reports, case studies, and a policy dialogue. In addition, the journal will also publish supplements either on its own initiative or on request from others.
