

Advance Site Visit for the 20th IIMC 2023 at SSTC on Population and Development: High-Level Consultative Conference Leading to ICPD30

The 20th International Inter-Ministerial Conference on South to South and Triangular Cooperation on Population and Development (ICPD30) will be held in Victoria Falls from October 8-11, 2023. The organizing team planned an initial site visit to discuss logistical arrangements with hotel management and local leadership. The main objectives of the site visit were to have an official meeting with Elephant Hills Resort Management, discuss with management from selected hotels, and assess Victoria Falls District hospital preparedness.

The team successfully negotiated discounted rates for four major hotels in Victoria Falls, including Elephant Hills Resort, Rainbow Towers Hotel, Azambezi Hotel, and Victoria Falls Hotel. The conference will be held in the Kalala Room, which can accommodate 500 delegates. The hotel will provide standard public address system, teas, and lunches as part of the conference service. The conference is expected to have 320 official delegates and 320 support staff.

Translations will be in English, Chinese, French, and Sign Language. Audio Visual Equipment will include head phones, table microphones, and a backdrop banner in the main conference room. A hybrid meeting may be held in August 2023, with arrangements made with the hotel and internet service providers.

A consultant was engaged by PPD to document the conference proceedings and create an outcome document. A district hospital site visit was conducted to assess the preparedness of the district health executive team. Follow-up meetings will be conducted every two weeks in August and weekly in September 2023. A follow-up site visit will be conducted during the week beginning 11 September.





Preparation and Networking Seminar on G20 Summit



At the invitation of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) of Bangladesh, High Commissioner Pranay Verma addressed an event titled "G20 Summit: Dhaka to New Delhi" organized by MOFA on 31 August to mark Bangladesh's participation at the G-20 Summit to be held in New Delhi on 9-10 September 2023 under India's Presidency.

The event was attended by the Foreign Minister of Bangladesh, *H.E. Dr. A K Abdul Momen*, Ambaassador-at-large and G-20 Sherpa of Bangladesh *H.E. Mohammad Ziauddin*, as well as members of diplomatic corps and senior officials of MOFA and other Ministries of Bangladesh.

In his opening address, *High Commissioner Verma* said that India's invitation to Bangladesh to participate as a Guest Country during India's G20 Presidency this year not only reflected the importance India attached to Bangladesh as a close friend and partner, but also underlined India's belief that Bangladesh's developmental experience and growing capabilities stood to add value to discussions at G-20.

High Commissioner Verma thanked Bangladesh, as India's closest neighbor and most special friend, for actively joining and enriching the G-20 deliberations in different domains throughout the year and for making India's G-20 presidency a great success.

Mr. Oliver Zambuko, Officer-in-Charge of PPD visit New York on UN SDGS Summit: High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development Convened under the Auspices of the General **Assembly**





The UN SDGs Summit, convened under the auspices of the General Assembly, took place in New York, USA, on 18 and 19 September 2023. The summit focused on key transitions to accelerate progress across the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including energy, digitalization, education, social protection, the triple planetary crisis, and food security. The dialogues discussed building resilience, addressing socioeconomic inequalities, applying science, technology, innovation, and data for transformative action, strengthening integrated policies and public institutions, and strengthening the multilateral system for enhanced support, cooperation, and follow-up on the SDGs.

The summit also addressed the need to mobilize finance and investments and the means of implementation for SDG achievement. The Secretary-General encouraged Member States to deliver on an SDG Stimulus, ensuring that developing countries can deliver on the SDGs and advance deep reforms of the international financial architecture.

The High-Level Commission on the Nairobi Summit on ICPD25 Follow-up launched a report championing a universal, unifying call for sexual and reproductive justice. The report called for simultaneous tackling of multiple forms of discrimination and barriers to sexual and reproductive rights. The event presented a new online interactive dashboard based on the global monitoring framework, a youth-friendly take on the report, and a youth engagement guide to making sexual and reproductive justice a reality for all.

Recommendations included adopting a Political Declaration at the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development, organizing bi- or multilateral meetings with stakeholders/partners on areas of mutual interest, and following up on the collaboration between SheDecides and PPD. The summit also highlighted the importance of addressing the weaknesses and inequities of the current multilateral system and the need for a more inclusive and effective approach to achieving the SDGs by 2030.
